Thank you to all those who have already registered on the new toolkit platform! For those that haven't, we want you to switch to the new website. This is how you can do it; There are new instructions about how to use the new toolkit in this short video which is also on the new website. You can register on the new web platform with just an email verification. There is no security registration code.

IF YOU WERE PREVIOUSLY ON THE OLD TOOLKIT SYSTEM:

- Your previous existing entries and progress cannot be transferred automatically to the new website. You still have access to your past entries and progress on the <u>old web platform system</u>. You can move your work to the <u>new website</u> by downloading all your information from the toolkit as a spreadsheet. There are instructions how to download the spreadsheet within the 5-minute video on the homepage of the <u>old</u> toolkit.



- You can copy and paste all your information into the new toolkit under each relevant criteria. Do not forget to click the 'Done' box for each of the criteria in the new toolkit. This is the preferred option. If it is not possible to do this, then you may instead upload the spreadsheet as a reference in the QIP002 criteria, and paste the following text into the completed criteria on the new toolkit 'This criterion was completed in our 2022 toolkit and is detailed in the spreadsheet attached to QIP002'

Decarbonisation of heating

The government is offering grants to help with the costs of green heating installations. The scheme is aimed at domestic and smaller non-domestic properties in England and Wales that have a maximum installation of 45kWh. Carbon Footprint and Cost Model tool for inhalers

GSK has launched a Carbon Footprint and Cost Model tool that shows the carbon footprint and costs over 12 months of your prescribing at the Health Board, ICS, PCN or practice level and how much you could reduce your carbon footprint and costs by switching to alternatives. Using this tool satisfies many inhaler prescribing criteria in the GIFH toolkit (PRS001 and PRS003), supports asking your Health Board or ICS to switch to less polluting inhalers (PRS005), and can provide evidence of your changed prescribing (PRS009, PRS010 and PRS011).
