#### What's happening with the 2023 Green Impact Awards?

Since the launch of the new GIFH web platform in February 2023, 744 practices have registered with individual 1610 users. There are about 50 new users each week. On the old GIFH platform in December 2022 there were 1446 practices with 1920 individual users.

The deadline for submissions this year was 30/09/23. Since then, a cohort of students have been trained and been doing the audits for the higher awards. Bronze awards have been audited by simpler on-line review of the evidence submitted without using the students. All the audits should be completed internally by 10th November, after which SOS-UK will moderate everything and finalise award levels by the end of November.

If you have submitted for a 2023 award, once you have received confirmation of your award level, you can 'retract' your toolkit on the 'toolkits' page to continue working on your next 2024 award. Please wait until after your 2023 award level has been confirmed to do this however.

### Toolkit update

**IMPORTANT WARNING** for users of the old toolkit platform: This is your **second warning** that the **old** <u>GIFH web platform</u> in use from 2014-2023 will be closed at the end of 2023. If you had an account on the old system, from 01/01/24 you will not be able retrieve any data from your old account. This will not affect your current progress or data on the current toolkit, and does not affect you if you registered for the first time on the new system.

Until 31/12/23, you can access past entries on the old web platform system and can copy/paste them to the <u>new website</u>. If you want to keep your information from the old toolkit, please download it. There are instructions how to do this in the 5-minute video on the homepage of the old toolkit. You can copy all the old information and paste into the new toolkit or you can upload the spreadsheet as a reference in the QIP002 criteria in the new toolkit website, and paste the following text into the completed criteria on the new toolkit 'This criterion was completed in our 2022 toolkit and is detailed in the spreadsheet attached to QIP002'. Do not forget to click the 'Done' box for each of the criteria in the new toolkit. Remember that after **31/12/23 all the information on the old GIFH web platform will be permanently deleted**! - The World Family Doctors (WONCA) October conference in Sydney launched with many other health bodies representing three million health professionals, urging international leaders to safeguard the health of global populations from the climate crisis in an <u>open letter</u> calling for all governments to immediately cease expansion of new fossil fuel infrastructure and production. This was reported in the <u>Guardian</u>.
- The BMJ and >200 world health journals in <u>editorials</u> call on the United Nations, political leaders, and health professionals to recognise that climate change and biodiversity loss are one indivisible crisis and must be tackled together to preserve health and avoid catastrophe. This overall environmental crisis is now so severe as to be a global health emergency.
- <u>RCGP annual report</u> 2022/23 is published online. The environmental report starts on page 22. If you have any questions or comments about this report, they can be raised at the RCGP <u>Annual General Meeting</u> on Saturday 18 November 2023 at 09:00. This is a hybrid meeting held both in person at 30 Euston Square, London and virtually via zoom. You can also send your comments/questions to greenimpactforhealth@gmail.com
- The UK Health Security Agency recently published this review: Research and analysis: <u>Climate change and public health indicators: scoping review</u>. This is a comprehensive review of indicators relevant for public health monitoring of climate change and health in England. The review was undertaken from spring 2021 to autumn 2022, reviewing indicators and data sources which were openly available at the time.
- Carbon Offsetting: Carbon Brief recently published a series of in-depth articles that focused on the hot topic of <u>carbon-offsetting</u>.

The <u>RCGP Net Zero Hub</u> has the following resources for General Practices

- 1. An e-learning module <u>Introduction to sustainable healthcare</u> highlights the carbon footprint of primary care and the opportunities to reduce our emissions in both the short and the long term.
- 2. The e-learning module <u>High quality & low carbon respiratory care</u> guides how to improve asthma outcomes whilst reducing the carbon footprint of inhaler prescribing.
- 3. The e-learning module <u>Understanding non-clinical carbon and general practice</u> identifies carbon emission hotspots and the actions needed to reduce the non-clinical carbon emissions
- 4. A free guide to <u>Decarbonising general practice Net Zero action plan for non-clinical</u> <u>emissions</u> that focuses on understanding and addressing non-clinical carbon within general practice.

The e-learning has been used by >700 people since its launch.

The <u>Net Zero service</u> matches a practice with a trained adviser who will work closely with the team to develop a decarbonisation plan.
