Toolkit update

IMPORTANT WARNING - Please note that we require all practice teams to clearly state their practice name and town in their team name on the toolkit (e.g. Central Practice, Cambridge). If your team name currently does not include the town name also, we require you to **update your team name by 7**th **March 2024**, in order to continue using the toolkit. You can do this easily under 'Team settings' once you've logged in. (see picture below)

If you are having any issues updating your profile, please contact <u>giforhealth@sos-uk.org.</u> Team names that have not been updated by 7th March will be automatically deactivated from the toolkit.

Green Impact for Health is a national scheme with almost 1000 participating practices. Maintaining accurate names is important to prevent new users from joining the wrong team, and for our monitoring and evaluation processes.

Opportunities to know about

o If you work in a general practice in Coventry and Warwickshire ICB, Birmingham and Solihull ICB, or South Yorkshire ICB, please consider completing a brief 5-minute online survey. The GPNET-0 study funded by the National Institute for Health and Care Research (NIHR), is investigating how general practice is implementing decarbonisation actions to make recommendations on how to accelerate their implementation and sustainability. The survey welcomes responses from all practice staff, and multiple staff from a singular practice can complete the survey. They want to receive views from all practices, irrespective of their current levels of engagement with decarbonisation actions.

There are a variety of incentives for completing the survey:

- For each practice that returns one or more surveys, 1 tree shall be planted by NHS forest
- A prize draw
- A certificate of participation for practices to display.

The purpose of the group is to increase awareness of the importance of planetary health, the links to patient health outcomes and promote carbon reduction across primary care; to provide a supportive network sharing knowledge and good practice and advising on the delivery of sustainable local events and initiatives; provide a forum for subject matter experts or have a general interest in planetary health to discuss and engage in the topic; develop leadership and learning opportunities; develop quality improvement tools for primary care to enable carbon reduction in the NHS; advice and guidance to the college; and provide a link to external organisations. Greener health

Reducing the environmental impact of medicines used in UK healthcare. Up to 90% of the medicines we consume end up in our wastewater. These pollutants can affect the health of wildlife, contributing to biodiversity loss. They are also driving antimicrobial resistance, one of the greatest global threats to human health. Pathology's solution to plastic reduction. How to get rid of most of the bits of plastic and the labels. There has been a lot of interest in Indexor - In the GP surgery samples are labelled with electronically requested barcoded labels and are simply scanned via an iMini scanner into a iRack. The iRack contains a RFID tag which holds the barcode identification and associated test but does not hold any patient identification. The samples are then placed into the rack and once collected by the dedicated courier the rack is placed into an iLogger case which starts recording transport information.

On receipt at the laboratory racks are loaded into docks all sample information is downloaded into the laboratory system and samples are ready for processing. Worklists are then interrogated for priority or time sensitive samples.

Green banks

In the <u>December 2023 newsletter</u>, there was information about how to change your personal bank. All the feedback has been that switching your personal account is easy using the 7 day <u>current account switch service</u> that changes all your in/out payments to your new bank.

Changing your business bank accounts is worthwhile but can be more difficult. It's worthwhile because if your bank is an investor in fossil fuels your finance emissions - from business bank accounts and pensions - can be one of the biggest contributors to your practice's carbon emissions. You can check your bank and your financial carbon footprint using this calculator. It's more difficult to change because its more complicated. Mothertree can switch for you for a monthly fee and a 12month contract.
