Reminder - The submission deadline for the toolkit is 30th September 2024.

To submit, log into the toolkit, click toolkit on the left hand column, then click the black 'Submit toolkit' button on the top right.





IMPORTANT - Please note, we require all practice teams to clearly state their practice name and town in their team name on the toolkit (e.g. Central Practice, Cambridge). If your team name currently does not include the town name also, we require you to **update your team name** in order to continue using the toolkit. You can do this easily under 'Team settings' once you've logged in.

Reminder - Our annual review of the contents of the toolkit is underway. If you want to help update the toolkit (or just make suggestions for improvement) over the summer by checking some (about 5 per reviewer) of the criteria for errors or timely updates, please volunteer by email here. It's a simple task that you can do over the summer. The deadline for completing your review is the end of August. You can earn up to 5 extra points for your practice by helping.

Opportunities to know about

o Write to your new MP

The UK Health Alliance on Climate Change has five priorities for the new government to sustain our health, health and care services, and the environment. The new parliament will be full of new MPs. This is an opportunity to make them aware of these priorities and the support that is needed in general practice. You can write to them via their new Westminster email address.

o Become a Climate & Health Equity Advocate: Action Skills Training

This Medical Society Consortium on Climate and Health free 6-part training series will help you do so. *This series will build upon the sessions from their 2023 series. o Have you switched to Tiger Bags in your Waste Management?

The roll out of that tiger bags has reached most of England now! See newsletter Nov 2022. This confusing and often undermanaged area of general practice is going through a process of improvement to improve its management and reduces costs. NHS England appointed a waste management agent www.anentawaste.com for most of England (subject to local ICB agreements). The biggest change will be that most of GP waste currently put in the Infectious waste (orange bags) will instead be out into the Offensive wastes (Tiger bags). The same vehicle will collect both Orange and Tiger bags.

GPs have separate contracts that they pay themselves for their commercial waste and recycling so it is worthwhile looking at your current arrangements and seeing if you can manage them better.
